Earth Day 2019 Judging Procedures and Guidelines SSU Student Posters - Informational (Not Original Research)

- 1. Review all judging materials. In your packet you will find the judging procedures and guidelines, the numbers of the posters you are to judge, and the poster evaluation forms.
- 2. Judge all of the posters you are assigned. The poster numbers are posted on each table and poster.
- 3. Please speak to poster authors.
- 4. Complete one form for each poster you are assigned. Please write your name on the form. Please total your score and write in the space provided on the bottom right side of the form.
- 5. Return completed forms to the registration table.
- 6. Please consider the following information when judging posters:
- Effective poster presentations:
 - a. Look professional
 - b. Have a clear focus (a viewer should easily be able to discern the <u>purpose</u> of a given poster, the poster should visually demonstrate the thesis of a student's research project)
 - c. Are concise and communicate only the <u>essential</u> information of a research project (including research questions and summary of research methods and results)
 - d. Convey the significance of the research project
 - e. Reflect the presenter's ability to accommodate the intended audience's needs, interests, and knowledge of the poster's subject
 - f. Avoid the use of jargon and acronyms
 - g. Integrate images and text in ways that are visually pleasing and allow viewers to discern a logical, wellorganized progression of information or ideas
 - Contain a good title, helpful section headings, and text in typeface that can be easily read from at least three feet away
 - Rely on graphs or charts as much as possible to communicate findings
 - j. Use color to attract and keep viewers' interest
 - k. Provide enough white space between images and texts so that the posters do not seem cluttered
 - I. Contain a bibliography (at the bottom or on the back of the poster) and photo or graph credits (at the bottom of each photo or graph).
 - m. Uses a variety of scholarly references, including peer-reviewed articles. Does not rely entirely on the Internet for research on the topic.
- Major judging guidelines:
 - a. How well the poster explains the issues or topic for the audience
 - b. The quality and professionalism of organization and visual presentation
 - c. If the poster does not report original research, how deeply the student has delved into the topic
 - d. If the poster reports original research, what is the quality of the research
